

Getting started with WAR Boards



Create a WAR Board

You can access WAR boards by navigating to [WAR boards](#) from the [3 lines menu](#).

To create a WAR board, click on the [Add new](#) option.

Choose your criteria

You will be presented with a list of fields to filter your WAR board by.

Simply select the criteria to your preferences and select [Update war board](#) when you have finished.

You can change your filters again afterwards by clicking on the [funnel icon](#).



Next, you'll need to choose a display method for your WAR board data. These are explained on the next page.

Manually arrange a WAR board

Selecting this option will allow you to manually sort your ungrouped pupils into defined categories. You can either choose to have **three** or **four** categories. You can rename the categories by clicking on the **pencil icon** next to each column heading.


Display a field

You can use WAR boards to identify which fields apply to your pupils. Simply select the field of your choice from the drop down menu to display a list of pupils who have data for the field.

Undo your changes


You are able to undo changes made to your WAR board by clicking on the [revert changes](#) option.

Add new

Clone your WAR board

You can make a copy of a WAR board by clicking on the [clone war board](#) option. This will allow you to make changes to your WAR Board without affecting the original.



You are able to share your WAR boards with other Class Charts users. To do this, click on the [share war board](#) option when inside a WAR board.




You will see the popup shown on the left. This menu shows you who can access your WAR board and the permissions that they have for it.

You can share your WAR board with your colleagues by clicking on the [add more](#) button.

To give a staff member access to your WAR board, simply [search](#) for their name and select the [permissions](#) you would like them to have.

The [read](#) permission allows your colleague to view the board and the [write](#) permission allows them to make changes,

Once added, your WAR board will appear in their WAR boards menu under the [shared with me](#) section.
